
COUNTRY SPOTLIGHT



Monash has exchange partnerships with seven institutions in France; studying with them can help you grow your international network, get a different perspective on international affairs and study French to perfect your language proficiency.

Organising your visa

You may need to travel to get it!

If you are a Monash Australia student, you will need to travel to Sydney for an appointment with at the French Consulate General. This is the only Australian location where you can apply for a student visa for France; make sure you budget for this in your financial plan!



Studying in French

Proving your language proficiency

If you wish to study in French during your exchange, you'll need to show proof of your language proficiency in French at time of submitting this application.

You'll need to request a letter from Dr Patrick Durel in French Studies, stating that your level of French is at least B2 in the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR). Submit your request via email at least a month in advance of the application deadline (15 October), to give Dr Durel time to prepare the letter



Studying Business in France

It's Business time!

We work with several renowned business schools in France, where you can study in English and earn credit towards your Business or Commerce degree. Check out ESSEC Business School or emlyon business school, where you'll be able to meet business-minded students from all over the world and have the chance to take French language and culture classes.



Options beyond France Alternative Francophone options

If you want to study in a Francophone setting, you could also consider institutions like the University of Geneva in Switzerland or HEC Montreal and Bishop's University in Quebec in Canada. Alternatively, think about a short term program like the study tour to New Caledonia, ATS3235!
